



1. Timing is crucial as the intertidal area is only accessible for a short period when the tide is lowest. Please arrive early at the pier as the boat cannot wait for latecomers.
2. Participants may have to go through the immigration checkpoint at the pier. Please bring your NRIC or passport.
3. The intertidal area is not a children's playground. Safety instructions by the guides, boat crew, warning signs, etc., must be adhered to at all times. The organizer reserves the right to abort the walk if the safety of the participants cannot be guaranteed.
4. The organizer cannot be held liable for any damages, losses, etc. of the participants' own belongings or injuries to persons caused during the walk.
5. This event is an outdoor activity subject to the whims of the elements. Please come prepared for bad weather (rain gear, poncho, plastic bags to waterproof valuables & electronic gadgets, change of clothing, etc.).
6. Trip may have to be aborted for safety reasons in case of a thunderstorm. No refund will be given in this case.
7. The intertidal area can be quite hot on a sunny day. Make sure you bring enough drinking water and protection against the sun.



8. Dangerous creatures, such as stonefishes, stingrays, jellyfishes, etc., are known to inhabit the intertidal area. For your own safety, only wear covered footwear with thick, sturdy soles (booties, trainers, etc. – see photo) and long pants to reduce the risk of being stung.



Strictly no sandals, flip-flops, or plastic bags wrapped around your shoes!

9. Participants will have to wade through water (see photo). You might want to bring another pair of shoes to change into after the walk.
10. There is no food/drinks on sale at Pulau Hantu. Please bring your own food and drinks.
11. Monkeys live on the island. To avoid drawing their attention, don't carry food items openly or in plastic bags. It is advisable to bring any food in airtight containers carried in a backpack.
12. Don't forget to bring your camera.



Reef Etiquette

The coral reef is a fragile ecosystem. By following these simple rules, you can help minimize your impact:

- * **Stay with your group and do not wander off on your own - your guide will identify sensitive or dangerous areas.**
- * **Do not touch or handle marine life except under expert guidance - even a slight contact can harm them and some can sting, bite or cut you.**
- * **Watch where you step – a lot of creatures bury during low tide.**
- * **Do not litter – dispose of your rubbish properly.**
- * **Do not collect anything.**
